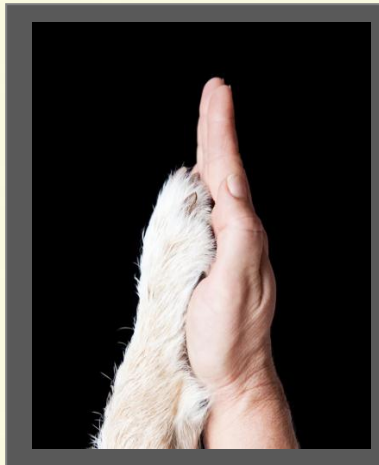

VOLUNTEER AS A KEY COORDINATOR

THESE ROLES ARE KEY ROLES IN NOAH'S ARK SOCIETY1. THEY REQUIRE A COMMITMENT TO THE MISSION OF NOAH'S ARK SOCIETY, A TIME COMMITMENT EACH WEEK, AND A LONG TERM DEDICATION TO ANIMAL RESCUE. WE'LL HELP TO TRAIN YOU AND GIVE YOU GUIDANCE FOR SUCCESS, BUT A SERIOUS LOVE AND DEVOTION TO ANIMAL WELFARE IS MANDATORY.

TRANSPORT COORDINATOR

Manage and keep up with our team of transport volunteers. Get applications from volunteers who want to transport, and add them to the volunteer database. You're also great at logistics. Managing processes like Pilots N Paws, relay transports and roger rover sound fun, and getting a dog from point A to point B in town is no problem, either. Transport coordination is about 50% pre-planned and 50% last minute. Of course, the long distance transports are all pre-planned and sometimes take more than a week of planning and coordinating, but the in town ones can be a sudden SOS because a dog is injured, sick or out of time. As a transport coordinator, you will work with our president and VP of Animals to help get our animals where they need to be. You'll have great tools at your disposal; Facebook, Dropbox, Adopt A Pet Volunteer Database, Rescue Connection and more to help make everything happen.

ADOPTION COORDINATION

Do you have at least 30 minutes a day to devote to animal adoption? We need coordinators for equine, canine, and feline adoption coordination. As an adoption coordinator you take responsibility for an animal from entry to rescue to adoption. You'll check in weekly with the foster family to get photos, updates, and make sure everything is going well. Once an application comes in for your animal you will acknowledge the application, get the reference checks done, schedule the home visit, and talk with the adoptive family about Noah's Ark Society processes, policies and the animal they want to adopt. If the application is approved you will get to facilitate one of the best and happiest parts of rescue, the adoption itself, when a former foster becomes a forever pet.

GRANT WRITING

Are you experienced in non profit work? Have you written grants before or want to learn how to help advance your professional career?

Our mission at Noah's Ark Society is to have a sanctuary where we can rehabilitate animals and utilize animal therapy to help with the rehabilitation of at risk teens. This goal will only be possible if we win grants to purchase the land that we will need to buy the sanctuary property and build it out.

We're willing to start small, but we need an expert to help guide us in the grant process.





VOLUNTEER COORDINATION

We are 100% volunteer operated, and it takes a village to get all the moving pieces of rescue to work. If you are a great communicator, highly organized, and love recruitment then we need you! You'll essentially be the HR Director of rescue, and will help us succeed every day with the contacts you make and keep.

ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES KEY COORDINATORS

EQUINE SENIOR

Horse rescue is your passion and you are knowledgeable about the needs of unhandled and neglected horses. You can recruit equine foster homes, transport volunteers, juggle the scheduling of farriers, vetting, deworming, and coggins.

Evaluating an owner surrender horse for adoptability is no problem, and you have enough fiscal responsibility to figure out the space and costs to bring in an equine from an animal control or legal agency that may be in rescue for an extended period of time. You are against horse slaughter, and will always carry an anti-slaughter message when asked about key issues in equine welfare. If someone has a training or wellness question about a horse, you feel that you can probably answer it with little to no research first.

This role is the most senior role within our equine division, and works overall with our VP of Animals and rescue president.

EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

Education is a huge part of our mission, and what better place to start educating on humane treatment of animals than in our schools? Our educational outreach director will be willing and able to meet with administrators, teachers and principals at area schools to coordinate for a Noah's Ark Society team to be able to come to the school to talk about animal welfare in a hands on, entertaining, and educational way.

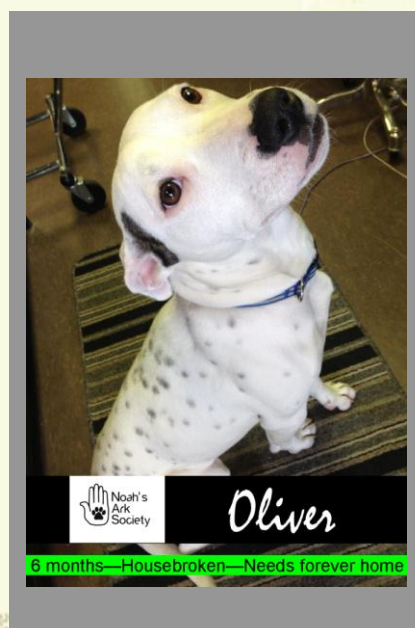
